This quarter begun with the celebration of Wildlife Week. As a part of this, several programs and activities to create awareness about importance and need of conservation of wildlife was conducted. Inspector General of Police, Southern Range, Mysuru Sri Praveen Madhukar Pawar, IPS, graced the inaugural event of Wildlife Week as a Chief Guest.

A week long program on captive management of wildlife was conducted to Final Year Students of College of Forestry, Ponnampet. International Cheetah Day was Celebrated and Zoo Education Team interacted with zoo visitors on the issues of historical distribution of Cheetahs, Current range, population status and conservation needs and initiative at national and international level.

Kannada Rajyotsava was celebrated with enthusiasm and active involvement of zoo staff and visitors. On Chidren's Day, thousands of Children availed the benefit of free entry to zoo and enjoyed their visit.

A milestone event during this period was opening of visitor entry gate between Karanji Lake and Regional Museum of Natural History (RMNH). This was long pending demand of visitors of Karanji Lake and RMNH as it would reduce the travel time between these two visitor facilities in Mysore and also promotes tourism and visitor flow to RMNH and Lake.

As a part of annual health checkup, zoo employees were screened for zoonotic diseases along with other health issues.

Routine repair and maintenance of zoo infrastructures was carried out to ensure the welfare of zoo animals, employees and of visitors. Sri Udaykumar, zoo employee, who worked for about 40 years with zoo at various capacities (Gardner, Animal keeper, Animal supervisor and Senior Assistant) retired from the service. 2. Wildlife Week – 2022

The celebration of 68th National Wildlife Week was observed from 2nd to 8th October 2022. The main objective of this campaign was to promote the conservation and protection of animal life. Wildlife plays a crucial role in maintaining the ecological balance of nature. Any harm to it can pose threat to entire ecosystem. Thus, making it important to preserve flora and fauna. Wildlife Week was started with the aim of raising awareness among the public to take vital measures for the protection of wildlife life.

In this regard Wildlife Photography Competition was held in Mysuru Zoo. Photographs of participants were dedicated to public viewing on 2.10.2022 by our Chief Guest Sri Praveen Madhukar Pawar, IPS, Inspector General of Police, Southern Range, Mysuru District. Sri Shivakumar. M, Chairperson, Zoo Authority of Karnataka, Sri Ravi B.P. IFS, APCCF, Member Secretary, ZAK, Sri Gokul Govardhan & Smt. Jyothi Rechanna, Members Governing Council, ZAK were also present during the occasion. The photo exhibition was open for public viewing from 2nd October to 8th October 2022 from 10:00am to 5:00 pm. The selected Photographs gave a glimpse of Wild animals in their Natural Habitat and in Zoo Set Up.













3. Training Program for BSc (Forestry) Students

4. International Cheetah Day - December 4th

One of the fastest animal in the world is racing for survival. Huge reductions in their natural habitat have pushed the number to just 7,000 individuals existing globally. International Cheetah Day is a Day to raise awareness about the fastest animal on land and to encourage people to help cheetah win the race against extinction.

In this regard Mysuru Zoo Celebrated this Day by displaying Posters and Fact Sheets in front of the African Hunting Cheetah enclosure to educate visitors. Zoo Education Officer and team of Mysore Zoo volunteers interacted with zoo visitors.

8. News in Brief

A. Brief observation on Calving Behaviour of Giraffe at Mysuru Zoo

Mysuru Zoo houses 8 Rothschild giraffes/Baringo Giraffe (Giraffa camelopardalis rothschildi) which is the subspecies of Northern Giraffe. It is listed as Near threatened by the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species in 2018, having the total population of mature individuals to be less than 1,468.


Babbi, a 9 year old female giraffe has given birth at Mysuru Zoo on 4th July 2022. Giraffes are Monotocous and their gestation period of a giraffe is 15 months.

In the last few weeks prior to parturition, Babbi's udder had increased tumescence. From the last 2 days prior to parturition she has decreased appetite. On the day of parturition, her vulva swollen and turgid. A week earlier to the delivery, Babbi was separated from other Giraffes and she was given a separate enclosure with a pen for safe calving.

On the morning of 4th July 2022, at around 11 AM, the amniotic sac, creamy colored was noticed by the keepers and by 11.10 AM the forelimb hooves of the fetus was present anteriorly in the sac. Along with the fore limbs, nostrils appeared followed by complete head and neck. During most of the labor period the mother was pacing around the enclosure. As uterine contractions continsued she had spread her hind legs and extend her head and neck forward, paralleling to the ground. At 1:10 PM the entire fetus was expelled, dropping from the height of 7 feet. The fetus fell down with the neck coming into floor contact first. The complete labour took approximately 2 hours.

The most striking behavior was from the movement of delivery. The mother started licking the calf's nostril and eyes to clear all the fetal membranes and viscous fluid. She positioned her feet in-between the calf's forelimbs which was at recumbent posture. She started softly kicking the calf's sternum to stimulate the calf to stand. As a reflex, the calf attempted to stand leaning against the mother's feet but failed in several attempts. It took 20 min of effort for the calf to completely stand up with the mother's





support. The young calf was identified to be female and it was 6 feet tall at birth, weighing approximately 80-90kg. It started exploring the mother's mammary gland and in a few attempts it was seen suckling the mother's brisket folds mistaking them for the teats. At 2 PM the calf consumed the colostrum from the right posterior teats. Three hours after delivery a large amount of lochia and placenta was seen expelled from the mother.

The calf is presently 6 months old and it has been introduced with the other Giraffes.

Common Entry Gate connecting Karanji Lake Nature Park and Regional Museum of Natural History Mysuru (RMNH) was dedicated for public facility on 18.11.2022 by Sri Shivakumar. M, Chairman, Zoo Authority of Karnataka in the presence of Sri Ravi B.P. IFS, APCCF, Member Secretary, ZAK, Sri Gokul Govardhan & Smt. Jyothi Rechanna, Members Governing Council, ZAK, Scientist C & H.O Dr. Arjun Prasad Tiwari and official of RMNH.

This entry would facilitate the easy movement of visitors, especially of Children, between these two facilities but also reduces the burden of travel on visitors, vehicle movement, fuel consumption and also vehicle parking problem. It is likely to increase visitors flow and also helps in spreading the message of forest conservation to an increased number of people.

Regular Health check-up was organised on 23.11.2022 for staff of Mysuru Zoo. Staff were made to undergo various tests such as Tuberculosis, Blood Sugar, Blood Pressure, Pulmonary Function Test and ECG.
